Oral - motor functioning is the area of assessment which looks at normal and abnormal patterns of the lips, tongue, jaw, cheeks, hard palate and soft palate for eating, drinking, facial expression and speech to determine which functional skills a client has to build on, and which abnormal patterns need to be inhibited or for which compensation is needed.

### What Do I Look for in an Oral Motor / Feeding Assessment ...

An oral motor feeding impairment is a child's inability to prepare food orally, move food through the mouth and/or swallow food. This is a result of muscle weakness, absent or altered anatomy and/or poor coordination of muscles in the mouth. Both sensory-behavioral and oral motor feeding impairments may result in inadequate nutrition, poor weight gain or weight loss, poor growth and in extreme cases, possible need for a feeding tube.

### DYSARTHRIA ASSESSMENT AND COMPREHENSIVE MOTOR SPEECH ...

Oral-motor treatments include stimulation to or actions of the lips, jaw, tongue, soft palate, pharynx, larynx, and respiratory muscles that are intended to influence the physiologic underpinnings of the oropharyngeal mechanism in order to improve its functions. Some of these interventions can also incorporate sensory stimulation.

### Adult Dysphagia: Treatment

The interventions needed are determined by an assessment, the Beckman Oral Motor Protocol, which uses assisted movement and stretch reflexes to quantify response to pressure and movement, range, strength, variety and control of movement for the lips cheeks, jaw, tongue and soft palate.
