Active learning helps to address this issue through in-class work and group discussions, often stimulating higher-order thinking and improving students' motivation to learn. But this is easier said than done, requiring continuous implementation of thoughtful strategies throughout the semester.

How To Promote Student Engagement Through Active Learning

A combination of a scavenger hunt and role-playing activity, this exercise is one of the more effective active learning strategies for adults. The facilitator assigns a case-study (preferably taken from common customer scenarios) to a learner. The learner, in turn, makes sense of the data and uses the available resources to solve the case.

Remove unnecessary barriers. Students can only be engaged in material that they can access and understand. This is especially true for your language learners and students with special needs. In their seminal work Active Learning: Creating Excitement in the Classroom, compiled in 1991 for the Association for the Study of Higher Education and the ERIC Clearinghouse on Higher Education, Bonwell and Eison defined strategies that promote active learning as “instructional activities involving students in doing things and thinking about what they are doing” (onwell and Eison, 1991).

Active learning is embodied in a learning environment where the teachers and students are actively engaged with the content through discussions, problem-solving, critical thinking, debate or a host of other activities that promote interaction among learners, instructors and the material. Active learning is not represented in the teacher-centered classroom where the teacher is an active transmitter of information and the students are passive recipients.
