Public Health Nursing — American Nursing History

Visiting nurse entering a row home surrounded by children and adults, Visiting Nurse Society of Philadelphia, c. 1890 Lillian Wald, founder of the Henry Street Settlement (1893) in New York City, invented the term public health nursing to put emphasis on the community value of the nurse whose work was built upon an understanding of all the problems that invariably accompanied the ills of the poor.

Public health nurses (PHNs) are on the frontline of the public health crisis the world now knows as the COVID-19 pandemic. They serve on mobile strike teams investigating case-contacts, deliver education on self-isolation and quarantine through hotlines and home visits, and interpret the rapidly shifting guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Public Health Nurse These specialists staff health departments, agencies, and mobile units. Each public health nurse must hold a bachelor of science in nursing (BSN) and obtain an RN license. Many employers require additional training, which leads to certification.
